- Unemployed individuals aged 21+ years





## What NOT to flush down the loo



Let's keep it simple - the only things that should ever go down the toilet are the 3 P's: pee, poo, and toilet paper. Here's why:

- The 3 P's pee, poo, and toilet paper: These are the only things that should find their way into your toilet bowl. They're designed to break down in the sewer system, causing no harm.
- Toilet paper is the only paper product to flush: Unlike other paper products, toilet paper is specially designed to disintegrate quickly in water. It won't cause blockages or clogs.
- Wipes clog pipes: Even though they may be labelled as "flushable," wipes don't break down like toilet paper. Flushing them can lead to stubborn blockages and costly plumbing repairs.

- Flushing wipes can lead to sewer backups:
   When wipes clog your pipes, they can cause
   sewer backups. This means sewage can flow
   back into your home, causing a messy and
   expensive problem to fix.
- Sewer overflows pollute the environment: In severe cases, sewer backups can lead to overflows, releasing sewage into the environment. This pollution can affect water quality and harm our ecosystems.

So, remember the 3 P's, and let's all do our part to keep our pipes, sewers, and environment clean and healthy.

### **Staying Safe During Snake Season**

Warm weather has brought snakes out of hibernation, so let's talk safety.

#### Where do snakes hide?

To protect your family and pets, remove common snake hideouts in your yard, such as:

- Rocks
- Overgrown Vegetation
- Long Grass
- Wet Grass
- Puddles
- Sunken Spots

- Pathways
- Piled Hoses
- Firewood Storage
- Open Areas Under Sheds/House
- Rubbish and Storage



### Snake bite: take immediate action

- 1. **Call for Help:** Dial 000 for an ambulance if you're alone. Give your location and try to get someone's attention. If you're with someone, have them call while you follow these steps.
- 2. **Stay Calm:** Avoid panicking or excessive movement, as it can spread venom faster.
- 3. Immobilise the Limb: Keep the bitten limb still.
- 4. **No Tourniquet:** Do NOT use a tourniquet.
- 5. **Apply a Pressure Bandage:** Use a shirt, towel, or scarf if you don't have a bandage. Wrap it TIGHTLY around the bite area, moving UP the limb until you run out of material. This restricts venom flow. If there's a nearby stick, use it to splint the limb.
- 6. **Stay Calm:** Wait for help. Try to remember the snake's description, bite time, and location (mark the bandage if possible).

### **Encounter a snake? Stay safe**

- Don't try to handle or kill it: Keep children and pets away. Snakes are not naturally aggressive and prefer to retreat. They attack humans when hurt or provoked.
- No capture attempts: If bitten, stay calm.
   Trying to capture the snake will likely lead to more bites.
- **Anti-venom available:** Anti-venom is accessible for all venomous snake species in Australia.
