Ranger Nardja shared stories of Birpai culture which allowed us a deeper understanding and appreciation of connection to country.

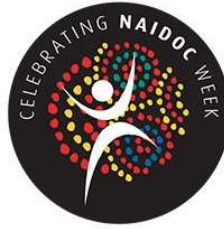
Mataihau Ah Mat

KEEPING YOUR HEATERS CLEAN
